The Distinguished Alumni and Teacher Committee is asking that every alumni consider nominating a teacher or alumni for recognition by the Association. Nominations may be made by e-mail to John Sachs. Again, at the Association's website, click on "Contact Us" where you will find John's e-mail link and telephone number. He welcomes each and every nomination and will gladly assist you with the process of compiling the relatively simple data needed to complete the nomination.

In making its selection, the committee looks to its Mission Statement for guidance. Excerpts are provided below to assist with your understanding of the process.

- 1. Those individuals recognized for distinction will have demonstrated not only expertise and success in their chosen field of endeavor, but will have conducted themselves in a manner that serves as a role model to current and future RHS Students and Faculty alike.
- 2. Each year three distinguished alumni will be recognized. Only one from each of five defined categories of endeavor will be chosen. Those five categories are:
 - a. Commerce and Industry
 - b. Government and Military Service
 - c. Education, Humanities, and Liberal Arts
 - d. Science, Medicine, and Engineering
 - e. Group and Individual Athletic Achievement
- 3. Each year three RHS Faculty educators will be recognized. Those will be an Active Teacher and two Former Teachers.
- 4. The Committee's overriding mission and purpose is to seek, find, and recognize those RHS Educators and Alumni who by their good works, deeds, and accomplishments inspire current and future RHS students and faculty to believe that they too can achieve distinction in their chosen field of endeavor, and that their affiliation with RHS will facilitate and enhance their chances for success

The Association encourages you to get involved in this rewarding and enjoyable process of looking for and recognizing RHS Teachers and Alumni that have done good works. It's not about the money they have earned; rather, it is about the positive impact they have had on others.

New Tech @ Ruston: Empowering Students for Success in the 21st Century

Building on a longstanding tradition of pride, excellence, and acclaimed achievement, Ruston High School is now poised to become the gold standard among those now implementing 21st Century teaching and learning models with the launch of its newest "school within a school," **New Tech** @ **Ruston**.

RHS researched the New Tech model for more than 18 months, visiting nine different New Tech sites throughout the country. **New Tech** @ **Ruston** is now slated to open with the beginning of the 2010-11 academic year. With a staff of eight, the program is already garnering high praise.

All eighth grade students from throughout Lincoln Parish were provided the opportunity to apply for this new academy initiative at RHS. Based on the national New Tech Network criteria, 100 positions were available for the opening class. Following informational meetings throughout the community, 127 applications were received from students at Ruston Junior High School, A. E. Phillips Laboratory School, and Cedar Creek School. A lottery-type drawing was then held to determine which students would be enrolled for the fall.

A non-traditional learning environment that will serve as an independent arm within the RHS Freshman Academy, New Tech @ Ruston begins with the end in mind. That end might be the completion of a project, a problem solved, a student's academic proficiency, or even their impending future in the real world.

New Tech @ Ruston utilizes Project-Based Learning to address both rigorous core curricular material and 21st Century skills that emphasize an authentic application of knowledge. During the first year, New Tech @ Ruston will offer the school's first curriculum integrated class—Global Studies, a humanities class that includes both English and World Geography. In addition, each freshman student in the academy will take Biology, Algebra I, and an Animation and Visual Effects class. Teachers within each class will develop highly engaging projects designed to meet the needs of today's 21st Century learner. With a 1:1 computer-to-student ratio in place, teachers function as facilitators and students are then empowered with greater responsibility for their learning. The process then yields a more productive and successful student who will ultimately become a greater asset to the post-secondary world awaiting them.
