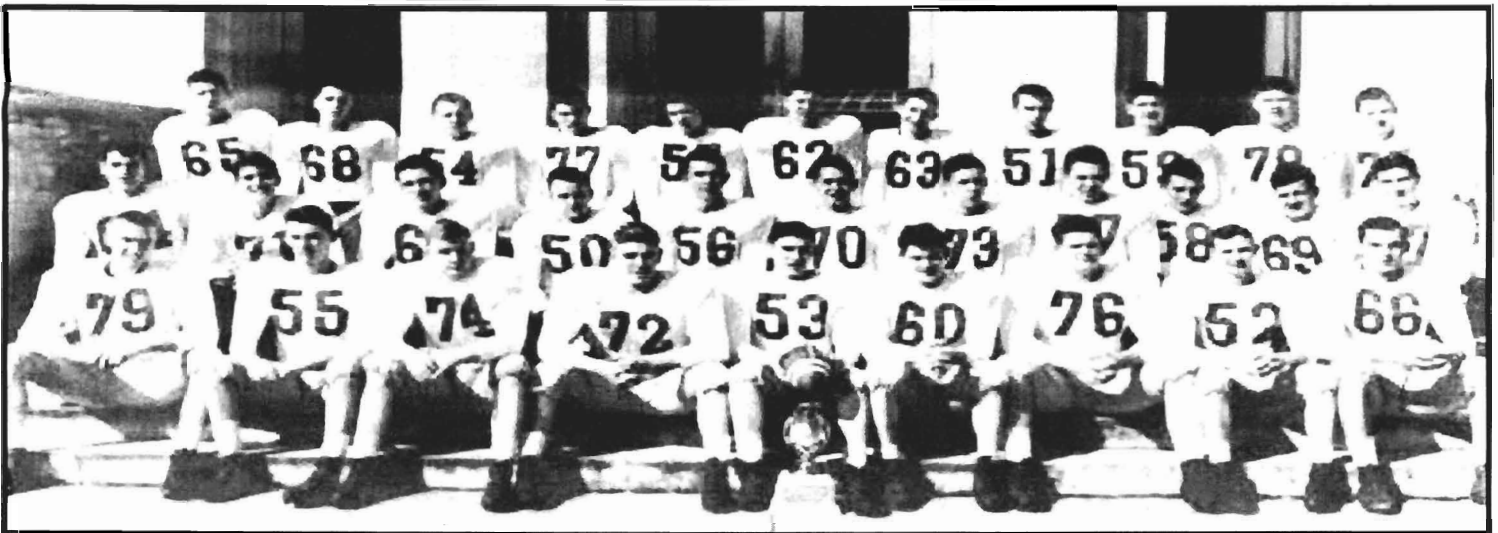
Principal Milstead's Message to Alumni

The 2010-11 school year was exceptional for the Ruston High Bearcats. In the fall we received the news of having one of our highest ACT average scores ever, 21.7, one of the highest in the state for non-magnet high schools. We also began the process of the implementation of our New Tech component of Ruston High—New Tech @ Ruston. Our school performance score of 109 is one of the highest in the state of Louisiana for non-magnet, public high schools. Our spring testing this year is evidence of continued growth for our school. The RHS graduation rate already exceeds the 2014 state goal. Other successes (Ag, FBLA, Cheerleaders, Sports teams, Art, etc.) throughout the year are evidence of a vibrant, exciting, educational institution that continues to grow in stature.

The 2011-12 school year possesses its own exciting prospects and challenges. Vertical alignment teams will work to make sure that there are no instructional gaps in our instruction program. Cooperation from other city and parish schools in this effort means that in future years, students will be arriving at RHS as better prepared 9th graders. The result is an even better product when those students graduate from Ruston High. Our New Tech program will be in its second year, having accomplished amazing things in the first year. My personal goal for this year is the continued establishment of professional learning communities that will allow us to become even better instructors of our students. The 2011-12 school year has the potential to be one of the best ever at RHS.

Class of '61 Auctions Quilt for Scholarship Contribution

Ruston High School Class of 1961 alumni Sharon Swearingen Tusa designed and made a quilt that was auctioned at the 50th year reunion of the Class of '61. The winning bidder at \$1050 dollars was classmate Ronny Graham and wife Judy Odom Graham, Class of '62. The auction proceeds benefitted the RHS Alumni Association's scholarship fund. Tusa created eight different fabrics using RHS symbols and logo plus the school's alma mater to make the 70" quilt. The quilt is made in the Carpenter's Square pattern. The Grahams have donated the quilt to RHS to be on permanent display there.

50th Year RHS Graduation Reunion by the Class of '61

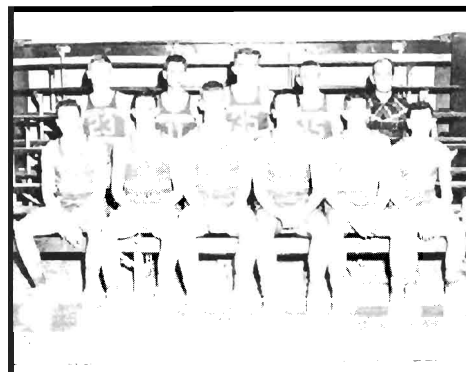

Over the years, *Chatterbox* has seen many changes and many faces. Just two years ago, Mr. Lloyd R. Bruner became the adviser for *Chatterbox*, and the new staff began working on what would become an award winning 32 page newspaper, printed August - June. The staff was required to be members of the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) and to assist in preparing various other projects and reports for competition. In the two years since this reorganization, the *Chatterbox* Partnership in Business Project has won the state championship at the State FBLA conference - both years. In addition to this recognition, *Chatterbox* members also used their writing and editing talents to earn additional state championships with the American Enterprise Project and the Business Plan Project, as well as Top 5 state finishes with the Community Service Project and the Local Chapter Annual Business Report.

Chatterbox became a member of the National Scholastic Press Association (NSPA) and was recently awarded a 2nd Class Rating. They are currently waiting results of their super critique from the NSPA, as well as several other possible recognitions for the hard work done by the staff. They are also anticipating the possibility of being included in the Best of the Best of High School Press. This year, *Chatterbox* is hoping to achieve even more and improve to an almost impossible 1st Class Rating.

In addition to providing Ruston High School students, faculty, staff, and alumni with an outstanding newspaper covering every aspect of Ruston High School, the staff receives excellent hands-on training in time management, discipline, leadership, and basic business principles. Thanks to improvements and access to technology, *Chatterbox* has come a long way! *Chatterbox* is completely funded by advertising, sponsors, and donations. As such, the staff has to solicit the funds necessary in addition to preparing the newspaper.
